Organization Profile

"Parivartan Sandesh Foundation" is referred to a Hindi word, and means "Message to change". Our focus is not only to provide financial assistance to under-privileged but also to spread the message to change the mindset, to adopt the moral values, to aware the people about their fundamental & human rights, message to use the strengths in right way, message to change the lives, message to develop good abilities , message to gain the knowledge

Parivartan Sandesh Foundation is a non profit, non-political, non-government organisation, registered under the Trust Registration Act XXI of 1860.



Governance

PSF continues to be an organisation with a small group of general members. Currently there are 6 General members (3 are women) including 3 Executive Council (EC) members. The EC consists of a President, a Secretary and a Treasurer. These members are from different backgrounds/ Professions – The President is a B-Tech, The Secretary is from banking background and The Treasurer is from Medical field. PSF doesn't provide fees or remuneration to members of the EC by virtue of them being EC members. Members attending meetings from out-of Delhi get their travel reimbursed, and their stay, for EC meetings and General Body meetings, is as a guest of PSF. A person who applies for membership and is accepted by ¼ of the members of the General body: shall be the member of the Advisory Committee. The membership of the Advisory Committee is open to all irrespective of caste, creed or religion. The EC of PSF appoints The Coordinating Director to implement the programmes and budgets approved by the EC. The Coordinating Director has overall day-to-day responsibilities of PSF.

VISION

A society based on human rights, equality, justice, honesty, social sensitivity and a culture of service in which all are self-reliant. PSF's focus and sole reason of existence is the betterment of Under-privileged in terms of Health, Education, self-reliant Skills and awareness of Social issues. Organization and sensitization of the community is the approach through which empowerment, capacity building and social transformation are attempted.

MISSION

Our mission is to promote sustainable social change by improving the living conditions of vulnerable populations, especially children.

To act upon the causes of poverty and inequality by influencing the policies and actions at a result oriented levels.

To identify and work alongside the economically and socially deprived- starting with children, so that they become educated, skilled and aware.

To make them enable to be self-reliant and enjoy a healthy, dignified and sustainable quality of life.



GENDER EQUALITY

In relation to PSF staff & Volunteers, we targeted to have 75% staff members to be women, and achieved this. At present, it is 95%. The work we take up, we are careful to have women's issues and women's empowerment very much a part of our work. Composition of board & staff is given in table below:

Social Accountability Practices

PSF sets "Outcomes", fixes "Indicators" and once roughly every 6 months, has a major external Evaluation. Annual audits of all accounts is done. Donor representatives, journalists, organizational visits and exchanges are always welcome. Till the time PSF works with support of Individual donors & makes written proposals of planned work, and then tries to follow the planned work outlined. Sometimes external factors (like fund shortage) affect those plans. PSF prepares work report of programme and audited financial statements. In our school we also enrol children from Leprosy effected families who are being neglected by society.

Health & Survival

Health is a fundamental driver for economic growth and development. Public health concerns itself with the protection and improvement of the health of the entire population through community-wide actions primarily by governmental agencies & then by social organizations. Every good health care system aims to prevent human from disease, injury, and disability; protects people from environmental health hazards and promotes behaviours that lead to good physical and mental health as well as assure availability of high quality Primary health services. Developed countries spend a high proportion of their Gross Domestic Product (GDP) on public health care because they believe that their resident health can serve as a major driver for economic activities and development, whereas societies with a heavy burden of disease, as a result of poor health spending tend to experience a multiplicity of severe impediments to economic development.

Improvements in health care are actually instruments for achieving economic growth and poverty reduction. That is, a better health care does not have to wait for an improved economy; measures to reduce the burden of disease and increased life expectancy will in themselves contribute to creating healthier and richer economies.

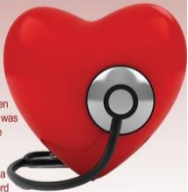
Saving Hearts

I still remember that on 28/8/2011 a person named Shiv Kumar was waiting for me with wet eyes at our office with her 1Year old daughter Akanshita . He was working as housekeeping personnel at Nutan Vidya Mandir, Seema Puri, Delhi-110092. He told me that his daughter was suffering from Patent Ductus Septal Heart Defect & required a heart surgery to implant a closure device; its expenses were beyond his limitations. His family was not supporting him & they wouldn't bother even if she died because she was a girl not a boy. He was begging me to save his daughter's life.

I promised him to take appropriate action & this was the first time when I visited to a Government hospital to meet the concerned doctor who was treating Akanshita. During my visit I spoke to many families who were waiting for their turns to meet the doctor.

Most of these families belonged to poor segment of our society & for a long time they knew about their children's condition but could not afford the surgery cost. Due to lack of proper treatment those children were not able to live a normal life.

Then we started our first initiative to Support Heart Surgeries of children, suffering from common congenital heart defect & with support of our donors we are continually perusing towards our goal & in 2013-2014, PSF supported 8 children in their Surgeries & supportive care after surgery.



Early Puberty

Most of us must have seen the movie PAA in which Mr. Amitabh Bachchan was suffering with a condition of early puberty due to which he was seen much older than his age. This movie was not a fiction, A report of WHO says that actually this problem persists in many children, about 1 out of every 5000 children in the world at different levels. We can understand the situation of a father who's daughter is suffering from this problem, where mentally she is just a child but physically she seems to be a young girl. Her family must be in high mental pressure firstly for her long term treatment & secondly for her safety & security. Early Puberty requires monthly treatment to control the hormones & treatment continues up to the age of 14-15 in girls depending upon their condition. PSF is supporting 5 girls who belong to poor families and are not able to manage the expenses of their treatment. PSF has committed to take care of their treatment till the time Doctor does not stop the process.

Fighting With Cancer

From past years number of cancer patients is increasing rapidly in India although Diagnose & treatment of cancer is now available with latest technology in India but it is very expensive & accessible to rich segment of society. A fact is that this problem persists maximum in lower income group due to exposure to bad Environmental conditions at home, at work place, due to consume unhygienic food, habit of tobacco etc. Cancer causes due to many reasons even in children this problem is being noticed rapidly. With support of other Social Organizations PSF has been supporting children to fight with Cancer at every stage of treatment & in 2013-2014, 3 children got treatment of Chemotherapy, radiation & surgery for Cancer.

Health for All

According to government research data about the status of Primary Health Care in India approx 77% percent of the country's population is settled in villages, rural areas & slums. Out of those 95% people are illiterate. Due to low literacy rate, lack of health awareness and poor condition of environmental sanitation, they catch up to preventable diseases very easily.

Awareness about hygiene, sanitation, prevention of infectious problem, personal care, and awareness to use available resources for good purposes can play an important role to decrease mortality rate at urban slums. Many other health issues are being faced by our nation like increment of AIDS cases, issues related to mother care during pregnancy & delivery at slums, birth rate etc. Awareness can be the first step to control.

Vocational Skills Development

In India, every year thousands of children are graduated and most of them do not have the specific skills required by the market. If this trend continues for a long time, our economic growth would soon be hampered. To prevent this situation, it is very important for us to change our mindset first. In India, people are obsessed with just achieving a graduation degree without thinking about the nation's long-term growth and development. This has led to a situation where, on the one hand, there are a number of unemployed graduates and on the other hand, there is a huge shortage of skilled workers in the market.

Vocational Education and Training is an important aspect of the nation's educational system. The aim of vocational education is to equip students with all the practical knowledge and social skills necessary for them to take on a productive role in the economy, by training for a specific career or business. It is also an essential tool to educate the employees for better performance and to earn profitable outcomes.

There is no age boundary in acquiring this type of knowledge. In India, vocational training is open to students, who leave school after 10th or 12th standards. Vocational courses increase the number of small businesses, which further increase employment.

Vocational Training provides an instrument for the promotion of worker employability through the enhancement of human capital and for productivity improvement and competitiveness at the level of the firm or nation. Manpower shortages can cripple economic growth. It can escalate wage rates, thereby reducing the competitiveness of the country.

Potentially Viable

SAMARTH to make Samarth Issue of women empowerment in India is always focused by social organizations & by Indian government which is needed to be taken up as seriously. Empowerment makes the women strong to fight with many social issues which they face rest of her life after the age of fifteen. PSF supports vocational & professional training to girls under SAMARTH Scholarship program to make them self reliant & to give them a chance to live with dignity & self respect. In 2013-2014, 5 girls were supported to get Nursing & Midwifery training from various institutes.

Spreading Technology

In today's world computer has become the most important tool for career & income generation courses. In private schools computer classes are mandatory from 6th standard. This is a fact that major portion of Indian population is settled in rural & urban poor areas. These families cannot afford to enrol their students in Private Schools to get updated with current requirements of advanced world. With the help of computer, single person can do the work of 10 people with more efficiency, early & with low costing, this has made the computer knowledge mandatory to many job profiles. PSF supports children computer courses at various institutes from age group of 10 to fifteen. In 2013-2014 PSF supported 68 students to get basic computer knowledge & short term courses





Sew Respect & Relations

We have seen many illiterate young girls & women belong to poor families who used to work at homes & factories. Where they face emotional stress, physical stress & sometimes have gone through Adultery & abusive behaviour of other male workers. In some cases even owners are also involved in torture. But they helplessly tolerate continue to work there due to poor financial condition of their families. PSF supports girls & women by providing Tailoring Skills to make them able to work from home, so they can live with confidence & can save their self respect. In 2013-2014 about 325 girls & women got benefited from Tailoring Learning School of PSF

Spreading Dignity

As we previously said maximum population of India is settled in rural & urban poor areas. Most of them get education up to secondary or senior secondary levels only, after this most of them do not get chance to get admission to govt. affiliated colleges for graduation due to high competition or lack of financial resources to continue their higher education. To survive they work as daily wages labourers. They depend upon their daily basis income which sometimes is not sufficient even to meet a single day expenses of their family. Youth wish to get latest resources & innovation in terms of Mobile phones, Two Wheelers, wish to go to modern food joints etc which is not possible for them to get, with their low income and turns them to involve in criminal activities (chain snatching, thievery, betting, pocket picking etc) to get easy & quick money. This increases the crime ratio which effects the growth of a nation.



In 2013-2014, PSF supported 3 deserving students to complete Higher Education & Technical Training courses to let them earn sufficiently and support their families & to society too.

Below advice explained the importance of awareness about social issues. Social awareness is generally defined in two ways. The first indicates that social awareness is the knowledge of what is socially acceptable and acting accordingly, whilst the second states that social awareness means being aware of different problems in society, and confronting them.

India is fighting with many Social problems since Independence of India. As a developing country the Priority of India is to defend with social issues related to Health, Education, employment etc. Knowing about social issues makes us more responsible and enables us to take efficient actions in favour of the society. For example, if more children are taught about the ill effects of global warming, they will be more responsible for the use of fuel.

Awareness is knowledge and knowledge is power. This means that when we create awareness among people, we are also empowering them to face certain difficult situations and at the same time we are helping them to overcome these difficulties. Social awareness also encourages people to take care of their health. In fact, when people will get to know about the ill effects of certain habits, they will behave more responsibly and try to be more active.

Be Aware

In 2013-2014 through various awareness activities and campaigns organized at various Shopping Malls, Schools, open markets & at corporate companies, PSF reached about 1, 75,000 people for awareness of Health issues, Importance of Education, Malnutrition, to stop female foeticide, to stop child abuse, to stop domestic violence, issues related to elderly, issues of poverty, preventable diseases, sanitation & hygiene, to promote vocational skills, to control the unemployment rate, drug addiction, population control etc

Serving Humanity

We believe that "Service to human being is service to Society and Nation" & during environmental emergencies & disasters, PSF efforts rapidly & strongly to support affected people. Through local authorities of the concerned place we provide amenities to victims for survival. In 2013-2014 PSF supported to 300 families affected from climate disaster at Kedar Nath, Uttarakhand in 2013 by providing grocery, C kerosene, Tent etc. Provided woollens to 280 families in winter at various slums, Supported with tent, grocery & essential amenities for survival to 75 families who came to Delhi for treatment of their loved ones at government hospitals who were suffering from critical medical conditions.

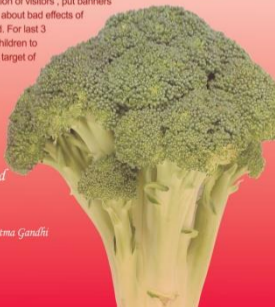
Very often we see that children carry their food in plastic bags which is wrapped in news paper & drink the water from school tank at MCD schools and primary schools at slums which make them sick & can have long term bad effect on their health & studies too. Under this project we reached to 1, 00,000 children and provided them lunch boxes and water bottles for prevention of curable diseases and other serious reactions of ink and Plastic bags.

Eat Healthy, Live Healthy

'Eat healthy and live healthy' is one of the essential requirements for long life. Children find themselves amidst a complex society that is undergoing breath taking changes. Today the basic meal i.e. "Roti-Chawal" has been replaced with wafers, chips, cold drinks, pizzas and burgers which cause many bad effects on children's health & indirectly to Nations' Health. We regularly keep the parents , children & youth aware through visiting schools, place canopies in marketplaces to get the attention of visitors , put banners and distribute pamphlets, to aware the students about bad effects of "Junk Food Items" & good values of natural food. For last 3 Months, PSF has reached to more than 1 Lac children to make them aware through this campaign with a target of reaching to 1 million by March 2015

Be Safe & Protector

Through organizing events in schools, PSF makes children aware about safety rules useful in daily life like road safety, fire safety, first-aid process, electricity risk & protection etc so that they remain safe & can be protect others with their knowledge. In 2013-2014 about 16000 children got benefited by these events.

The children at times are forced to starve and are given worn out clothes to wear. Such is the story of millions of children in India painful and yet true. 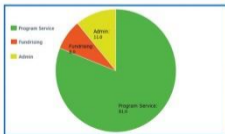
